New Academic Year starts

The new academic year for 4th year MBBS was started on 12th of February 2025 with an orientation session. Faculty members were introduced. Students were given briefing regarding attendance requirement to sit in professional examination, lectures, small group tutorials, and field visits. They were informed about academic process, departmental expectations and types of assessments. Time tables were also shared.
